

Students with a minimum 2.0 grade-point average (GPA), who are enrolled in at least eight units each quarter (one unit during Summer Session) and have purchased an OwlCard, are eligible to join student government. ASFC applications are available in the ASFC Office and online. The weekly meetings of Campus Council are open to students, faculty, staff and the public. Meetings are Thursdays at 2 p.m. in the Toyon Room. Attend a meeting, see student leadership in action and find out how to increase university transfer, career and internship options; work collaboratively; and advocate for student rights. 
