The goal of the Associated Students of Foothill College (ASFC) is to give a voice to all Foothill students, enabling them to become an integral part of the campus community. 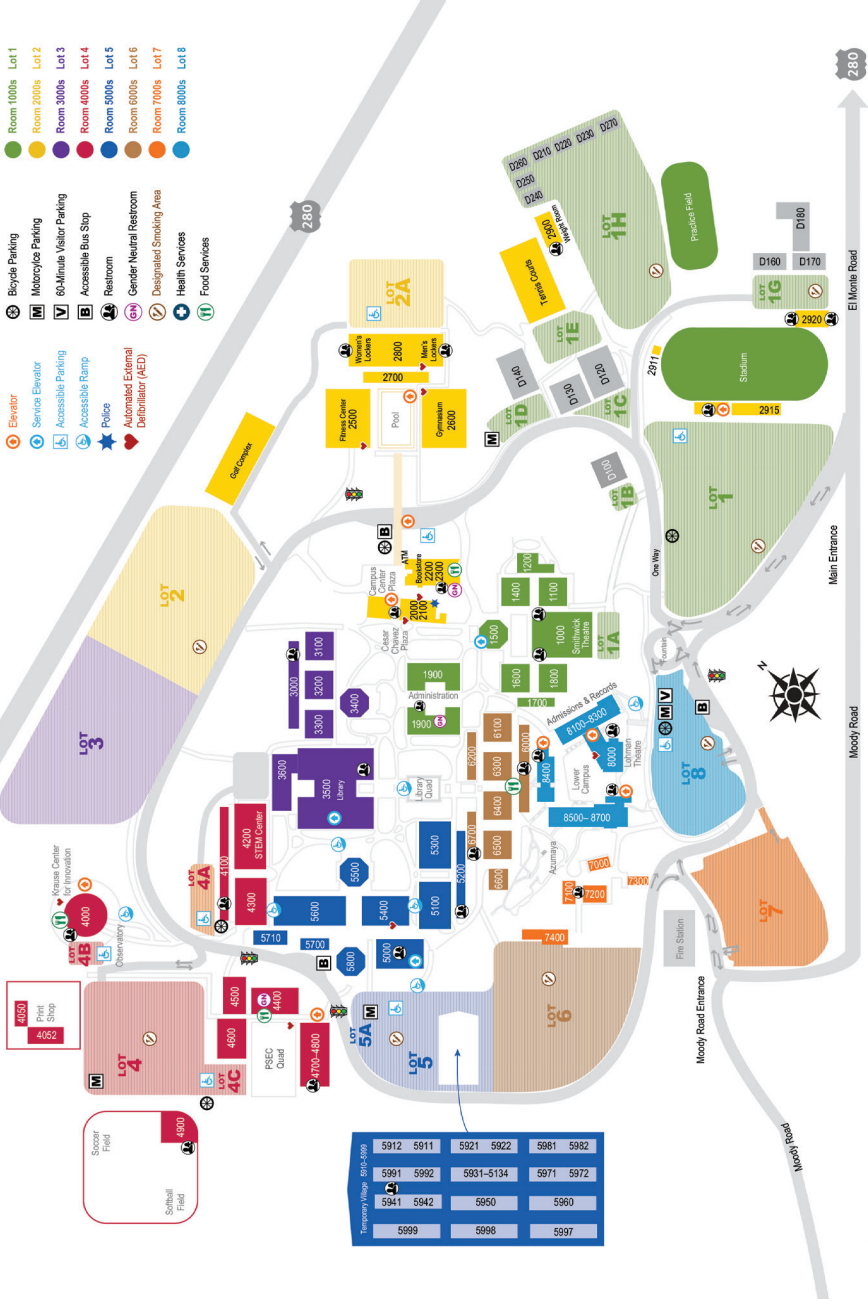
