It was a showcase for using the Reggio Approach (Reggio Emilia, Italy) in urban USA. The Reggio Schools accredited the MELC for excellence in adapting their approach. Her first book on the MELC is *Possible Schools: The Reggio Approach to Urban Education* (2006). Her second book is *Powerful Children: Understanding How to Teach and Learn Using the Reggio Approach* (2008). Her 3rd book, *Infants and Toddlers at Work* on cognition in children 0 to 3 is a best seller as is her 4th book, *Twelve Best Practices for Early Childhood Education*. Ann lectures frequently to parents and educators and in classrooms, literally "fanny on the floor," she demonstrates diverse practices for teachers of
