Discussion Detail

Goals

- To have a better understanding of goal versus action, the committee has redefined it into three categories: Access and Entry and Transition.
 - Access: Making sure college is open to all by fostering connections with groups both within and outside the campus; understanding access as broad series of interconnected relationships that move beyond fascile notions of representation. Increase partnership and connections.
 - Entry: Is the mechanics of becoming a student, placement testing, transportation, or the ground works for matriculation. Making entry seamless and effortless.
 - Transition: Making sure students are able to accomplish their selfdetermined goals once they have entered the college
- Three goals
 - Access: Development of comprehensive engagement strategies that address the needs and challenges of all students' populations, constituent groups, and community stakeholders (businesses, etc.)
 - Entry: Streamline entry functions and activities into one cohesive system.
 - Transition: Engage in a highly coordinated effort to equip students with the means to identify and achieve their self-defined educational goals.
