

Projections by County





Note: Foothill service area defined as Los Altos, Los Altos Hills, Mountain View, Palo Alto, Sunnyvale.






Projections by Age




Projections by Ethnicity

Projections by Gender





Income by Ethnicity




Over one-third of people living in Mountain View and Sunnyvale who speak a language other than English at home <u>also</u> feel they don't speak English very well.

Attainment, Preparation, Attendance


Educational Level by County


High School Graduation Projections


HS Graduates and College Prep



Almost half of those employed in the county are employed in the service sector


