PD Outcomes

- Assessment: Post-event surveys
- Findings:
 - 96% of respondents said "yes" to "Will you use the info/training from this PD event in your work?"
 - 89% of respondents rated effectiveness of PD event in terms of improving your knowledge and/or skills as excellent or good
