



What is Participatory Governance?



- Constituents have opportunity to participate and have views considered
- College planning and budget prioritization is transparent
- College planning and budget prioritization is disseminated
- Document college planning and budget prioritization

Governance as Priority

 89% of respondents agree it is "very important" to be informed about college planning discussions and decisions.




Engagement with Governance: The Good and Not So Good

- What's rewarding
 - Contribute to college goals
 - Work with colleagues
- What's challenging
 - Required more time
 - Lack of leadership



Engagement with Governance: Increase Involvement



 A question of access? How do you get involved? 79% believe there should be professional development about the college planning process.



Engagement with Governance: Staying Informed

- Top 5 methods
 - Email (81%)
 - Division mtgs (56%)
 - Senate mtgs (52%)
 - Web (44%)
 - Department mtgs (35%)
 - Each of these methods were identified by at least 1/3 of respondents




Engagement with Governance: Informing Others

- Communication frequency
 - Monthly and Quarterly (60%)
- Communication methods
 - Reporting out at mtgs (41%)
 - Email (35%)




Engagement with Governance: Participation Over Past 5 Years

 - Senates, Core Mission Wrkgrps, PaRC



Governance Structure Suggestions: Time for Update?



 ½ of respondents agree BUT at least 1/3 are uncertain (perhaps more information/context needed)



Governance Structure Observations

- Don't feel I know enough about it.
- Current structure makes it difficult to attend and participate.
- Unclear who is in charge of what, and which committees have what kind of rule and authority.
- Build mechanisms to allow [participation] to happen.



Governance Structure Observations

- We just revised college ed master plan. Accordingly, now is the appropriate time to review our shared governance handbook and organizational structures to make sure they support our updated plan.
- New president should have input into the system of governance participation.



Setting a Planning Structure Agenda

- Increase knowledge about participatory governance structure
- Increase access and opportunity for participation
 - Involve faculty and staff
 - Managers should encourage participation



Setting a Planning Structure Agenda

- Participatory governance can create a stronger sense of community
 - Working with colleagues
 - Working toward a common goal (college mission)
- Participatory governance can be more effective
 - Professional development—leadership development
 - Increase faculty and staff involved so workload decreases



Setting a Planning Structure Agenda

- Email and Division mtgs seem to be good methods for communication as majority report them being effective
- Time to begin discussions but maintain current structure through accreditation visit?
