(1) WELCOME

Erin Ortiz, Classified Senate President-Elect, sat in for Karen Smith, Classified Senate President and PaRC Tri-Chair.

(2) APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Draft minutes from 11.04 and 11.11 PaRC meetings were approved by consensus.

(3) CANVAS / OEI PARTICIPATION / C.O.O.L. (Report Out)

Judy Baker provided updates on implementation of Canvas, Foothill College's participation in the Online Education Initiative (OEI) and an update on the Committee on Online Learning (COOL).

(4) SUSTAINABILITY PLAN / REPORT (1st Read)

Brenda Davis Visas presented the current version of the Sustainability Report. She noted that no annual reports have been done since the last report was drafted in 2009. She added that her goal is to incorporate feedback from PaRC and make additional modifications to align the report with the EMP and Facilities Master Plan prior to publishing in January 2016. The three main questions presented were:

- (A) Is the Sustainability Report Card "too clean"?
- (B) What else does the Report need (e.g. reporting water bottle usage)?
- (C) How can the Sustainability Committee gather additional members?

(5) ENROLLMENT PRIORITIES UPDATE (Report Out)

David Ulate presented on students' registration patterns for Foothill College, specifically a breakdown of students by their enrollment/registration priority category and an analysis of whether students are taking advantage of the registration window they are given. David noted that the methodology tracks registration attempts (or clicks) – it doesn't not track 'shopping around' or viewing classes prior to a registration attempt.

When describing the priority registration categories, David noted that a student must fit all criteria within a category to receive that registration status. Paul Starer asked if we have to ability to find the students who attempted to register but did not actually click register (or simply found the process too difficult and stopped trying). Anthony Cervantes noted that a helpful feature would be to have a shopping cart for classes that you gather ahead of time and then register for when the time comes – this might give an idea of section size, if new sections are needed, and provide a preview of what the students actually want. Lan Truong added that it would be helpful if all departments planned ahead and created a comprehensive list of what classes are being offered on a yearly basis – this would help with the creation of more realistic Ed Plans (especially for the AD-T students).

David summarized that more students are trying to register earlier than they did under the old registration system/structure. While this front loading is occurring, the low priority students are waiting until after their priority window to register. It was asked if the registration priorities actually encourage 'positive' behaviors (e.g. Full Time, Ed Plan completion, etc.).

Carolyn Holcroft noted that the Academic Senate is currently considering a resolution that would ask the District to reconsider incentivizing Full Time versus Part Time, and perhaps incentivize completion of an Ed Plan (which is much less of a life-changing decision than choosing to move from Part Time to Full Time). She also noted that there exists a need to examine how the incentives we offer related to the equity agenda on campus.

(6) SSSP ADVISORY COUNCIL UPDATE (Report Out)

Amanda Kolstad, the new SSSP Coordinator, presented the 2015-16 workgroup objectives for the SSSP Advisory Council. Their objective is to provide leadership in the college's implementation of our Student Success and Support Program (3SP) plan to improve access and success through orientation, assessment, counseling, educational planning, and academic interventions and to foster a college-wide culture committed to collaboratively increasing student success.

The group's targets are:

- (A) Increase educational plan completion among students at Foothill College.
- (B) Optimize resource utilization among Basic Skills, Student Equity, and SSSP through increased communication and collaboration.
- (C) Assess current 3SP efforts and implement solutions to maximize 3SP completion.

An online survey will be sent out to solicit feedback from all Foothill College faculty, staff and students. The results of this survey will be presented at the next PaRC meeting (W 12.02.15). Some of the feedback may be incorporated into a future revision of the proposed College Mission Statement.
