ITEM I - Minutes of Oct. 1, 2008 were approved by consensus

ITEM 2 – A. LAMANQUE, ED MASTER PLANNING OVERVIEW

- Andrew Lamanque gave an orientation and overview of Ed Master Planning resources to use for Goals and priorities for Financial planning for next year.
- Judy mentioned the district’s concerns for midyear cuts – she reported that there is enough in contingency funds for 08-09 but district has serious concerns about 09-10.
- When faced with making reductions, she emphasized that we must not ask “what” we cut but “what do we need to support” - what are the core activities that we must support to do right by our students and have that guide resource allocations in the next year.

- Process and flow of communication and responsibilities is outlined as they have been in the past. If we change the RT Guidelines, the order of some things may change. Namely Cabinet would be ahead of Ed Resources in the order of process.....they did not have some of the info that cabinet did about various programs and how they related to institution initiatives. Graham's diagram would a little different if that change is approved by RT.
- RT will review ALL programs plans - in the past RT did not have input to Ed Resources. Goal that we have substantive participation from all areas.
- How program SLOs are used in the process is important on the program level outcomes. Are we asking the right questions, are we putting right assumptions on students who complete program?
- ACTION: 100% participation has not taken place in the past. If program does not participate they will not be on the list for resource allocation. Will be reviewed based on content and two programs (Physical Education and CTIS) will complete this year and the rest will complete according to the various years drawn in the lottery on opening day.
