ITEM 2 – PRESENTATION STUDENT RECRUITMENT AND OUTREACH HAYWOOD SMITH, HARRALL, J. KO, P. SANGER

Highlights of Presentation:

Data shared is available on Office of Research website

General Activities Include: Visit more than 50 high schools, give presentations, Stu Svc Triage, campus based outreach, new student info sessions, student ambassador program, campus tours, student workers orientation and campus events

Financial Aid/EOPS outreach staff integral component – presentations must include information regarding financial aid

Foster Youth groups, veterans groups, middle schools, classroom visits

International Programs - 800 students from 70 different countries

Along with Marketing – coordinates print ads, radio ads, direct mailings, online campaigns

Outreach is not only outside of college – it includes many services on campus

ASFC student government – More than 51% of ASFC expenses are devoted towards outreach

Hope to increase income with new students coming to campus due to financial downturn

Veteran's Program: Recruitment at PA Veteran's hospital Anticipate founding of a vet club in Winter 09 for general assistance and to assist homeless vets

Workforce Development projects: Careeer Tech Ed Grant Funds to outreach to schools, families, and community to introduce them to career programs

Career exploration for 900 middle school students

QUESTIONS:

K. Smith – clarify difference between outreach & recruitment vs. development & retention Answer: retention is part of the outreach, but separated in Roundtable mission only

Do we have programs for returning students – we do not have an official "re-entry" program

Working with Richard w/workforce development - CTE grant

Numbers of traditional vs returning - would be interested to see break down by division

S. Barker: Ed resources 2.4 million 08/09 deficit - \$4.1 anticipated in 09/10

RT guidelines were reviewed for resource allocations during this crisis

Shirley reported that enrollment is up and increase in productivity

K. Smith rumor question: Classes that didn't have full enrollment were cancelled, rumor is that some were reopened – in actuality, some were moved to community education fee based course in which case the instructor took much lower rate to teach the class

It takes 37 students to pay for a class not 20

Cancellations were made based on enrollment trends – saved a lot of moving 1st week
