Summer Bridge Math Is Student-Friendly

Every student is different, and math can be more of a challenge for some students. Many students arrive at Foothill and discover that they must take several pre-algebra courses before they're eligible to enroll in college-level math classes. Often, this may be because students experience math anxiety, didn't score high marks on the math placement test, or may have a few gaps in their math knowledge. Our program gives us the opportunity to work with you to improve your placement testing score. We'll help you master key math concepts, and prepare you to be successful and earn good grades in math courses, including intermediate algebra and beyond.

Program Eligibility

You're eligible for our program if:

- you're a recent high school graduate and you're enrolling at Foothill College for the first time.
- you took Foothill's math placement test, the results placed you in a lower-level math class (*MATH 235, 230, 220, 217, 108, 105; NCBS 401A/B*) and you believe that you're capable of doing well in higher-level math courses.

Sign Up: It's Easy as 1-2-3!

You must register for the program by **Monday, June 30, 2014.**

To sign up, follow these easy enrollment steps:

1. Get a student identification number (SID) by submitting Foothill's online *Application for Admission* at www.foothill.edu/admissions.php. There is no fee to apply. You'll then receive instructions by e-mail to activate your SID and **MyPortal.fhda.edu** account.
2. Once you have a student identification number, contact Academic Services Coordinator Craig Gawlick at **(650) 949-7240** or gawlickcraig@foothill.edu.
3. Take the math placement test before the program begins. You can schedule an appointment at <http://foothill.edu/placement>. If you have questions, call the Assessment Center at **(650) 949-7672**.
