1. Minutes: June 3, 2014	Section #5: clarification of the term “multiple measures” in reference to placement. Move to approve the minutes with the clarification (Francisco, Starer) M/S . 1 abstention, Approved .
2. Announcements: a. CCC Notification of Proposed Prereq/Coreqs b. New Course Proposals c. Report Out from Divisions	Speaker: Isaac Escoto a. Prerequisites for ENGL 1B and 1BH presented. The English department is still having discussion regarding the best possible statement that clearly explains the requirement(s) to the students. b. New Course Proposals: Comment was made that the form does not give us info regarding the prereq, coreqs or advisories. Gomes addressed questions regarding the ART series in reference to possible prereqs. She explained the protocol in Art school and course alignment. Concern expressed about LINC courses and a possible repeatability issue. c. Report Out: TRC Rep: Bea Cashmore is stepping down but has had two volunteers: Jess Miller and Janet Webber will share the responsibilities. FA: Robert, Simon and Hilary will continue their service, but Carolyn Brown and an additional adjunct faculty member will be assisting. LA: Library is moving to 3600 building. There will be no access to the library during the 2 nd week of summer session. ESLL 26 as a prereq for ENGL 1A issue is being discussed. We should have a solution by the end of Fall quarter.
3. TMC Opportunities	Speaker: Isaac Escoto Escoto presented three TMCs in the pipeline that we might be able to offer. Completing any of these additional TMCs is not required, as we don't offer a local degree in the same discipline. We look at these as additional opportunities. Since we don't have some of these courses, would we be allowed to use a DA course to fulfill required courses? This is the question we posed regarding the Music ADT. As of right now, we have not gotten a response from the State. There seems that multiple people think there would be a huge draw for the Elementary Teacher Ed ADT.
4. Threshold Concepts/Wicked Problems	Speaker: Carolyn Holcroft, Isaac Escoto Holcroft and Escoto introduced the concept of wicked problems and threshold concepts. A wicked problem refers to (among other things) a problem difficult to solve because of multiple stakeholders with differing opinions and an interconnection with other problems. There was conversation about the possibility of addressing wicked problem(s) in our curriculum. Could this be addressed in major preparation or would looking at general education in a different way work? Discussion about what it would look like if a wicked problem was explored from the angles of different disciplines. What does a student need to understand in order to “get it”? These are known as

	threshold concepts. There are plans for future professional development sessions touching on wicked problems. Discussion about a potential pilot project.
5. CCC Representative Participation	Speaker: Isaac Escoto Discussion about how to encourage colleagues to participate in CCC. Where is the balance between the time/history/experience in CCC needed to do a good job as a rep and encouraging new folks to be involved as well. It was suggested that we look at the feasibility of introducing an online option/component to CCC that may encourage more participation.

Who “Owns” Curriculum?

Faculty!!!

Per Title 5, curriculum is one of the 10+1 areas of primary reliance given to the Academic Senate.

“The college and/or district curriculum committee recommending the course shall be established by the mutual agreement of the college and/or district administration and the academic senate. The committee shall be either a committee of the academic senate or a committee that includes faculty and is otherwise comprised in a way that is mutually agreeable to the college and/or district administration and the academic senate.”

Title 5, §55002.

Who Serves on Foothill's CCC?

- **Co-chaired** by VP of the Academic Senate and the Associate Vice President of Instruction
- Meetings are open to all
- **Voting faculty:**
 - Faculty Co-Chair (votes only in event of tie)
 - Up to two representatives from each division (each division has one vote)
 - Articulation/Curriculum Officer
- **Voting administrators:**
 - Three instructional deans
- **Non-voting members:**
 - Administrative Co-Chair
 - Others: ASFC representatives, the curriculum coordinator, and an FA representative.

What is the role of the CCC?

- Establish practices and processes for curriculum development
 - in collaboration with the Academic Senate
 - done through resolutions process
- Review, approve new degrees & certificates
- Prevent unnecessary duplication/overlap among curriculum
- Review, approve courses for inclusion in the Foothill GE pattern
- Ensure compliance with Title 5, Ed Code, & other state/local regulations
- Develop campus-wide educational policy

The Foothill CCC does *not*....

- Approve new credit courses
- Approve distance ed addendum applications
 - These are division CC responsibilities

CCC Reps: Roles & Responsibilities

- **Represent** your constituents at each CCC meeting
- Arrive **prepared**
 - Read agenda, attachments prior to meeting
- **PROMPTLY report** CCC activities, information, and decisions to your constituents
- Promptly provide the Curriculum Coordinator with **local curriculum committee minutes** identifying all course and program changes,* as well as reporting these out to CCC

CCC Reps Responsibilities

- Serve as a resource to constituents (full time and adjunct) for:
 - Navigating Foothill curriculum development and approval processes
 - GE pattern
 - Writing and reviewing Course Outlines of Record

Why are Course Outlines of Record So Important?

- required by Title 5 & regional accreditation standards
- serve as basis for approval of degrees, certificates, and system-wide GE requirements
- basis for articulation agreements
- provide quality control across all sections of a course
- It's not about “rubber stamping”

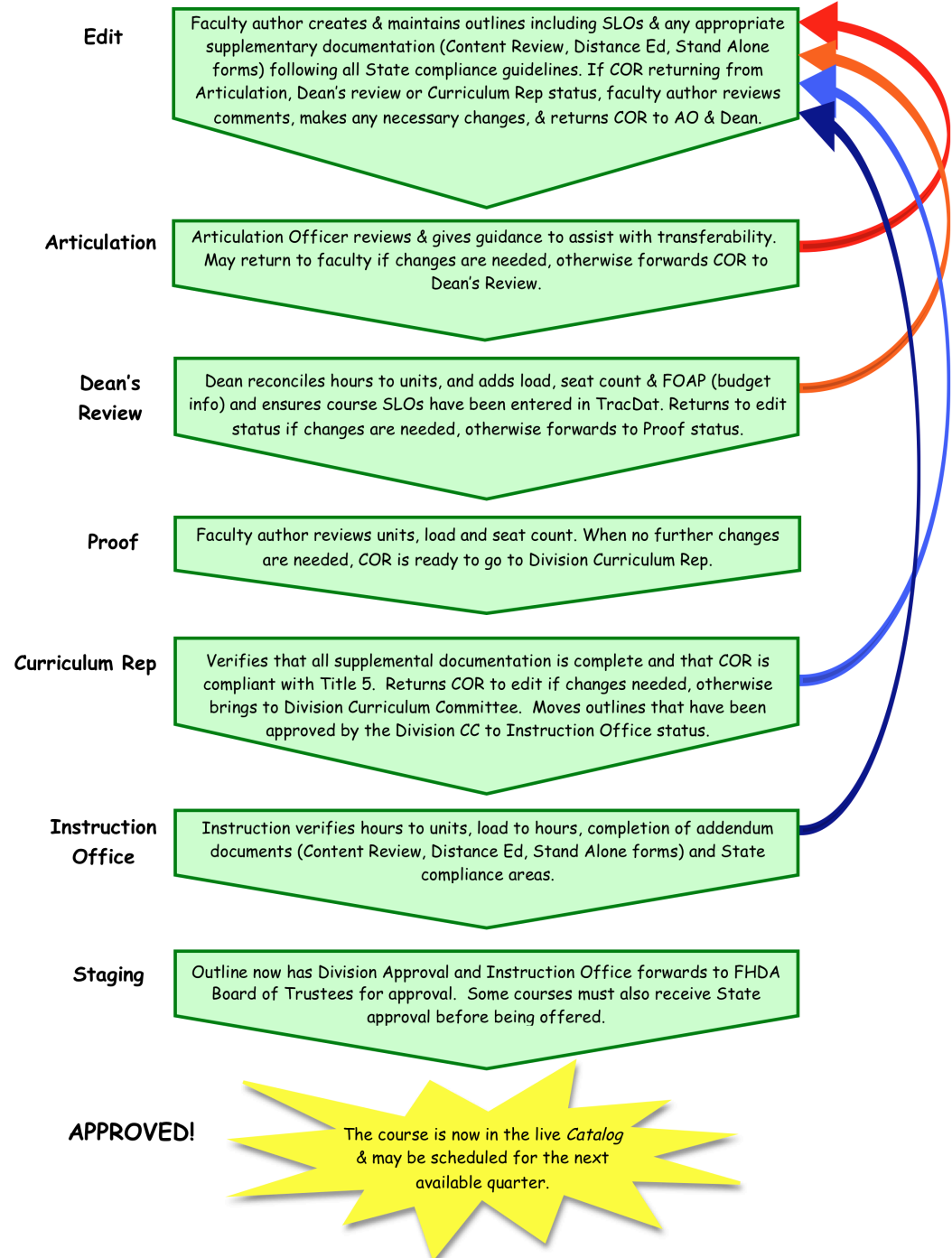
Foothill's Curriculum History

- Foothill is unique in its curriculum process.
- 1992 decision allowed individual divisions to approve their own curriculum.
 - STRONG division committees are imperative in order for this to work
- Result: CCC focuses on developing campus-wide curriculum issues and educational policy

Resolutions Process

- Formalizes the decisions and policies of the CCC
- Streamlines communication
- Writing resolutions:
 - Up to four “Whereas” clauses to present background, argument/rationale
 - Up to four “Resolved” clauses to direct action, articulate policy, procedures, etc.
 - Must be distributed with the agendas, and come for first/second read before action as per Robert’s rules

Proposed Title: Music Theory For Audio Producers & Songwriters

Proposed Catalog Description: Introductory course in music theory as applied to audio production, music technology and songwriting. Study elements of music including melody, rhythm, chords and musical forms. Learn to read and conduct orchestral scores. Understand traditional music notation as applied to MIDI sequencers, Digital Audio Workstations (DAWS) like Pro Tools and notation software like Sibelius and Finale. Understand rhythm, drum and percussion notation to program MIDI sequencer Event Lists, virtual percussion and drum sample libraries. Transcription exercises and the study of contemporary songs from artists such as Dave Matthews, Red Hot Chili Peppers, Jimi Hendrix, Miles Davis, Led Zeppelin, and songs chosen by students. Learn to build awareness of specific elements in complex musical arrangements. Study the Nashville number music notation shorthand system. Develop ability to quickly and effectively recognize chord progressions. Harmonic ear training introduces perfect pitch and relative pitch exercises for audio engineers to make equalization decisions based on key signatures and chord changes. Can be taken concurrently with any other music theory course.

Proposed Catalog Description:

Explore the connection between the varieties of wine and culinary dishes. Preparation/serving of various appetizers, salads, main courses and deserts and comparison of how wine choice will enhance or improve the dining experience. Class will be guided by an expert in the field of wine selection. Guest speakers will include guest chefs and wine makers presenting specialized expertise on the relationships between food and wine.

Students must be 21 years of age or older to register for class. Proof of age and identity required.

Lecture-laboratory Conversions

As you are all aware, as required by the state, we are phasing out the lecture-laboratory activity type beginning with the 2015-16 Catalog/school year. I've provided a spreadsheet to your dean and curriculum reps that list all the courses in your division that have lec-lab hours. **All changes must be to the Instruction Office by October 31st to ensure that the courses may be taught for the 2015-16 year (beginning with Summer 2015).** In November, the Office of Instruction will review the remaining courses along with the information received for alignment, with ACCJC and Title 5 requirements.

Carnegie Activity Definitions:

The State requires us to use the Carnegie definitions of lecture and laboratory which are:

Lecture: a class that allows the instructor to treat subject matter with a scope and intensity that requires students to study independently outside of class time (Title 5: 5500, Standards and Criteria for Courses). For each hour of lecture, it is assumed that students will be required to spend an additional two hours of study outside of class (Program and Course Approval Handbook. 5th ed Sept 2013, California Community College Chancellor's Office p80).

Laboratory: based on the number of hours of scheduled laboratory work, presuming that students complete most required work in class. (Program and Course Approval Handbook. 5th ed Sept 2013, p80). The Carnegie standard is one unit of credit given for each three hours per week of laboratory.

Logistics for making the corrections:

1. Please use the spreadsheet to identify the hour adjustments.
2. If the hour adjustment is the **only change** you are making to the course this year, please **do not make the correction in C3MS** as this will cause a back-up in the system.
3. If you are making **other changes** to the outline this cycle **you cannot** use the spreadsheet to make the hour adjustments. Go directly to the C3MS and make all your corrections and proceed through the normal approval process as you would with all other curriculum changes.
4. If the adjustment in hours causes a change in the unit value, the Instruction Office will submit the outline to the State Chancellor's Office for approval.

The following criteria provide a comprehensive list of factors campuses may use to select their admitted class. Based on campus-specific institutional goals and needs, admissions decisions will be based on a broad variety of factors:

1. Completion of a specified pattern or number of courses that meet breadth or general education requirements.
2. Completion of a specified pattern or number of courses that provide continuity with upper-division courses in the student's major.
3. Grade point average in all transferable courses.
4. **Participation in academically selective honors courses or programs.**
5. Special talents, achievements and awards in a particular field, such as visual and performing arts, communication or athletic endeavors; special skills, such as demonstrated written and oral proficiency in other languages; special interests,

such as intensive study and exploration of other cultures; experiences that demonstrate unusual promise for leadership, such as significant community service or significant participation in student government; or other significant experiences or achievements that demonstrate the student's promise for contributing to the intellectual vitality of a campus.

6. Completion of special projects undertaken in the context of the college curriculum or in conjunction with special school events, projects or programs.
7. Academic accomplishments in light of the student's life experiences and special circumstances.
8. Location of the student's college and residence.
