RE: Early Summer Survey Results

Overview

Students who enrolled in the early summer session (June 6- July 17) were identified and invited to complete an online survey asking whether they would have enrolled in the same course(s) if it were offered during the regular session only. There were 507 respondents out of 3,061 students, representing a response rate of 17%. Note that 60 students who completed the survey had dropped their early summer course(s) by the time the survey closed, representing 12% of all survey respondents.

Highlights

- Slightly over half of the respondents indicated that they would enroll in the same course were it offered during the regular summer session (52%) while one-third indicated they would not (33%).
- Almost half of the respondents reside in Santa Clara County (41%) and almost one-fifth live in Southern California (South of Santa Barbara) (18%). This response rate is comparable to non-respondents (Santa Clara County: 38% and Southern California (16%).
- Students living in Northern California (north of San Francisco) represented a higher percentage of respondents than non-respondents (8% of vs. 5%).
- Respondents indicating they would enroll in the same course during regular summer session enrolled primarily in BSS (40%) and FAC (26%), while those who responded that they would *not* enroll during the regular summer session were enrolled at a higher percentage rate in BSS (53%), but a lower rate in FAC (16%).
- Students responding that they would enroll in the same course during the regular summer session were more likely to indicate: 1) they needed/wanted to enroll in course; 2) the course was not offered during regular summer session; and 3) the early summer start date conflicted with finals at other quarter system colleges
- Students responding that they would *not* enroll in the same course during the regular summer session were more likely to indicate: 1) conflicts/limits with schedule and plans; 2) a preference for both sessions (students were enrolled in both summer terms for acceleration and to divide up courseload)

- Students responding that they were unsure if they would enroll in the same course during the regular summer session were more likely to indicate that it would depend on their schedule and plans, but that they still liked the early summer timing.

Table 1 shows the response rate to the main survey question about student interest in enrolling in regular summer session should the same course be offered.

Methodology

Early Summer students are identified based on their enrollment as of June 13, 2016 (census date) and sent an email invitation that included an embedded link to a two-question survey. This survey was created using Remark software, and was available online between June 20 and June 27, 2016. Each survey linked to a unique password connected to the student id, which determined whether the respondents were a representative sample among all early summer students.



I actually would have preferred enrolling in the regular summer session but the classes I wanted to take were only offered during the early summer session. I actually would've preferred the regular summer session dates since the early session overlaps with my three spring classes. I only signed up for the early session because the class I need to take was not offered during the regular summer session.

I could not find the class I needed (Ethics in Accounting) anywhere else.

I really wanted to take Children's Literature, but it was only offered during the early summer session. It started the day of my finals week at Cal Poly.

I would've much preferred to take it later during the regular summer session.

If my class was available during regular sessions, i would take that because i still have to deal with finals.

If the class I wanted was only offered in the regular summer session I would prefer that.

I am currently enrolled in a quarter system school and wanted to take summer classes to get extra credits. With the early summer session, my summer class started before my finals had ended which was not ideal. Other than that, it really doesn't matter to me.

I am on the quarter system at my school, and that only time my class here was offered was June 6th. This was hard considering I was preparing for finals that week.

I am taking Foothill summer classes to fulfill GEs. I go to a university that is on the quarter system and I am taking two summer classes. One class is during the first summer session and the other one is during the second session. The first summer session overlapped with my finals week at school, which was a huge hassle. It would have been nice to not have that overlap, but at the same time it is nice to have the two classes a bit more spread out. I do think that someone from a semester school would have a very different perspective as they end classes in like May and start school in August. From that perspective, I might not choose to take summer classes that late in the summer.

I do not like that the early session overlaps with my spring quarter finals

I prefer to have overlapping classes in summer
