Non-Credit Parenting (NCP) Enrollment, 2015 (HSF) v2 RE:

#### Overview

Students who registered for Non-Credit Parenting (NCP) courses in 2015 were identified to determine their course enrollment patterns. There were 584 students who enrolled in at least one NCP course, making up a total enrollment of 956 (Table 1). Seven students enrolled in credit courses during 2015, making up an enrollment of 30.

When examining the overall course enrollment, it appears that the majority of students enrolled in NCP 400 and NCP 402 (74%) (Table 2). Over two-thirds of the NCP enrollment occurred in Winter 2015 (39%) and Fall 2015 (29%). Appendix 1 shows more detailed enrollment data, at the course, section and term level.

Table 3 shows the NCP courses in which students enrolled. Almost all the students enrolled in only one NCP course (90%). The most common NCP course combination was enrollment in NCP 400 and NCP 402 (5%). Note that these data does not show the number of sections in which students enrolled, as a student could be enrolled in multiple sections of one NCP course.

Most students appear to successfully pass their courses (77%). Nonsuccess grades were earned in ENGL 1S/242A and CHLD 88B; students withdrew from ACTG 1B, CHLD 89, CNSL 5, and MATH 10.

Demographic disaggregation shows that an overwhelming majority of students enrolled in NCP courses were female (79%) (Table 7).

The educational level of students is inconclusive as the majority of students are Special Admit/Unknown (60%) (Table 9). Despite the limited data, almost 20% of students earned an AA/AS degree or higher while 30% have attained a high school diploma or equivalent.

### Methodology

NCP course are non-credit and no final grade is awarded. These are non-transcriptable courses. Students were identified by enrollment in NCP courses in 2014-15 with a registration code of RA, RE, RW. Students with no contact hours recorded were excluded from this analysis. Only the highest reported educational level was counted. NCP courses included in this analysis: Winter 2015: NCP 400 CRN 31756, 31757, 31822, 31823, 31818, 31754, 31755; NCP 402 CRN 31739, 31740, 31741, 31814, 31816, 31811, 31747, 31749, 31752, 31753, 32131; Spring 2015: NCP 400 CRN 42074, 42075; NCP 401 CRN 42374, 42435; NCP 402 CRN 42382, 42383, 42386, 42429, 42424; NCP 403 CRN 42391, 42392; Summer 2015: NCP 403 CRN 11015, 11027, 11028, 11029, 11030; Fall 2015: NCP 400 CRN 22508, 22509, 22522, 22523, 22524, 22525, 22526, 22527, 22531, 22532, 22534, 22535, 22888; NCP 401 CRN 22889, 22890.
