Accreditation Overview

What is accreditation?

Voluntary peer review process by which the institution reflects on and publicly demonstrates effective use of instruction, services, resources, operations in continuing and ongoing efforts to serve students better.
 Continuous improvement of academic quality and public accountability

It's about improving student success!



Accreditation Overview

Why seek accreditation?

Student transcripts are transferrable

Student credentials/awards are seen as legitimate and accepted by employers and other higher education institutions

Maintains federal financial aid eligibility

Quality assurance

Colleges meet the Standards and eligibility requirements




Accreditation Overview

- Who is our accrediting agency?
 - Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC)
 - One of seven regional accrediting organizations
 - Associate degree-granting institutions, with authorization to offer baccalaureate degrees
 - CA, HI, Guam, American Samoa, North Mariana Islands, Palau, Micronesia, Marshall Islands
 - Authorized to operate by the Department of Education

What is the ISER?

Institutional Self-Evaluation Report

- Honest evaluation of strengths and weaknesses
- Continuous assessment of areas for improvement
- Reflective, analytical, forward-thinking approach regarding our policies and practices in facilitating student success
- Evidence of meeting the Standards, student achievement of institutional set-standards

Action Plans

Quality Focused Essay (QFE): Improvement plans with action projects embedded

- Standard areas and statements have not changed since previous accreditation cycle
- ACCJC is currently undergoing their regular, 10-year review of the Standards, and subsequent changes will impact our next cycle







Accreditation and Planning Cycle

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Standards and Writing Teams

Standard I: Mission, Academic Quality and Institutional Effectiveness and Integrity

College Planning Committee

Standard II: Student Learning Programs and Support Services

- Instructional Programs: Instructional Planning and Budget Team (IPBT)
- Library and Learning Support Services: Academic Services
- Student Support Services: Student Services Planning and Budget Team (SSPBT)

Standard III: Resources

- Human, Physical and Financial Resources: Administrative Planning and Budget Team (APBT)
- Technology Resources: Technology Committee

Standards and Writing Teams

Standard IV: Leadership and Governance

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- Decision-Making Roles and Processes: Academic Senate and Classified Senate
- Chief Executive Office: College Planning Committee
- Governing Board: College Planning Committee and Chancellor's Office
- Multi-College Districts: College Planning Committee and Chancellor's Office



Timeline

Opening Day 2022:

Accreditation Liaison Officer shares with campus community the purpose of accreditation and ISER process

October 2022: Accreditation Liaison Officer reports to shared governance groups about ISER process and solicits a team lead for each section



October 2022-June 2023: College Planning Committee (CPC) meets to work on and monitor standards in conjunction with shared governance groups serving as writing teams.

Timeline

Dec. 1, 2022: Writing teams submit first drafts

- Feb. 23, 2023: Writing teams submit second drafts
- May 11, 2023: Writing teams submit third drafts

May 25, 2023: Writing teams submit fourth drafts

June 2023: Accreditation Liaison Officer shares combined drafts

- Combined draft is shared with college through a virtual workshop
- Drafts are sent to Office of Communications for editing and design

July 2023: Office of Communications reviews and directs questions to teams and Accreditation Liaison Officer

August-September 2023: Office of Communications continues final editing, formatting and production

Timeline

October 2023: Campus groups and individuals submit feedback on edited draft

- College Planning Committee hosts collegewide event to share edited draft
- Accreditation Liaison Officer shares edited draft with governance groups, seeking formal approval

November 2023: President submits final draft to Board of Trustees for approval

Dec. 15, 2023: College submits report to ACCJC

Spring 2024: Evaluation team conducts site visit and comprehensive review

 - Act as a collective entity
 - Is independent, policy-making body
 - Bylaws and policies are publish evaluated
 - Act in accordance w
 - Reviews key indicate of student success
 - Program for board development and evaluation
 - Upholds code of ethics
 - Is informed re: accreditation and supports college efforts to improve

STANDARD IV.D

- 7 Standard Statements
 - CEO provides leadership in setting and commuting expectations; and assures olleges
 - of responsibilities
 - Effective resource allocation policy
 - District CEO delegates to College CEOs to implement district policies
 - Planning and evaluation are integrated with colleges
 - Communication across district is timely, accurate, and complete
 - Regular evaluation

Standard IV.C.3: The governing board adheres to a clearly defined policy for selecting and evaluating the CEO of the college and/or the district/system.

Functional Map – *currently under revision*.



Functional Map

District and Colleges reviewed all 128 standards.

Primary (P), Secondary (S), Shared (SH) responsibility of standard. – College AND District

District gets a 'P' if we have independent responsibility.

Is this something the district does and <u>can</u> accomplish independently?
■ Primary – 47, Shared - 28



Functional Map Examples

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Both College and District are Primary Standard 1A1: Mission Statement Only College is Primary ■ Standard 2A6: Scheduling of Courses Only District is Primary Standard 3C3: Technology resources are implemented, maintained, and secure. Shared Responsibility
