OER Adoption Data Collection Efforts •

We need your help! The OERI has established a simple mechanism for any faculty member to report an OER adoption so that we may gather adoption and minor adaptation data as a component of the ZTC reporting. Each textbook equivalent has a button that leads to a brief form.

Facilitator-Supported Open Educational Resources (OER) Accessibility Basics Course •

Anatomy and Physiology Courses: Identifying and Addressing Barriers to Getting to Zero

During the 2020-2021 academic year, OpenStax indicated that at least one faculty

member at 61 California community colleges reported adopting <u>OpenStax</u> <u>Anatomy and Physiology</u>. At about the same time, the OERI funded a team of faculty to separate out the anatomy components of the text to better meet the needs of discipline faculty [<u>Human Anatomy (OERI</u>)]. More recently, a team of faculty made additional updates to this text with a focus on creating or modifying images to better align to their courses [<u>General Human Anatomy (Lange et al.</u>)]. What further modifications would support the faculty at your college who are teaching anatomy and/or physiology?
