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Title 5 regulations define roles/responsibilities for faculty, students, and staff

- Faculty (Title 5 §53200)
  The areas of "Academic and Professional Matters" (the '10+1')
- Students (Title 5 §51023.7)
  - The areas that have or will have a "significant effect on students" (the '9+1')



#### Role of the Academic Senate Title 5 §53200 – Definitions "The 10+1" "Academic and professional matters" means the following policy development and implementation matters:

- 1) Curriculum, including establishing prerequisites and placing courses within disciplines;
- 2) Degree and certificate requirements;
- 3) Grading policies;
- 4) Educational program development;
- 5) Standards or policies regarding student preparation and success;
- 6) District and college governance structures, as related to faculty roles;
- Faculty roles and involvement in accreditation processes, including self-study and annual reports;
- 8) Policies for faculty professional development activities;
- 9) Processes for program review;
- 10) Processes for institutional planning and budget development; and
- 11) Other academic and professional matters as are mutually agreed upon between the governing board and the academic senate.



# Students 9+1 Rights (Title 5 §51023.7)

#### "Significant Effect on Students" - The "9+1"

- 1. Grading Policies
- 2. Codes of Student Conduct
- 3. Academic disciplinary policies
- 4. Curriculum development
- 5. Courses or programs which should be initiated or discontinued
- 6. Processes for institutional planning and budget development
- 7. Standards and policies regarding student preparation and success
- 8. Student services planning and development
- 9. Student fees within the authority of the district to adopt
- Any other district and college policy, procedure, or related matter that the district governing board determines will have a significant effect on students



# Staff (Title 5 §51023.5)

No list of specific areas, but:

- Staff shall be given "the opportunity to participate effectively in district and college governance."
- Staff shall participate in the formulation of district and college policies and procedures that "have or will have a significant effect on staff."
- "The policies and procedures of the governing board shall ensure that the recommendations and opinions of staff are given every reasonable consideration."



## Where does governance happen at Foothill?

### Faculty: Academic Senate

- **Students:** Associated Students of Foothill College (ASFC)
- **Staff:** Classified Senate

Also in governance committees such as MIPC, Technology Committee, etc.
