The finance team sist down with the deans to identify the best funding sources for each request. We look at categorical funding first. We met with Ram first as SYEM has the most requests. Most of this is handled in R&R which has a study group. Kathryn Maurer: What is the group's name? Bret Watson: Budget Request Review Study Group. The finance team helps the deans identify sources to use. We are trying to find the best source of funding. Similar to the old OPC, but we refined that process by including finance experts. Kathryn Maurer: I would caution that not all constituents are involved (students and faculty). Bret Watson: We have meetings scheduled for the other divisions. Anthony Cervantes: COVID relief funding? Bret Watson: Great Point. We have three groups of stimulus funding. CARES ends June 30. Then, HERF II and HERF III allows us to make up lost revenuethe Bookstore, facility rentals – we lost up to one million dollars – we can use federal funds to recoup. 		Categorically funded positions will need			
		to be reviewed and possibly reduce			
		discretionary spending.

		Bret Watson: The Operational piece is			
		working.			
		Thuy Nguyen: Maybe study group is not			
		correct. It is an operational team meeting.			
		Bret Watson: It did not originally have			
		faculty and student members. OPC did			
		have tri-chairs. Now we are just			
		identifying sources of funding.			
		Kathryn Maurer: What do we need to			
		keep in mind in forecasting? We started			
		the year terrified about the budget and			
		are now more optimistic?			
		Bret Watson: We are more optimistic			
		than in 2020. The May Revise is coming,			
		but there is definitely a rosier picture			
		than this time last year. State revenue is			
		positive. Look at Susan's presentation			
		on the Board website.			
		Thuy Nguyen: Please discuss the use			
		of B-budget funds to cover the shortfall if			
		necessary.			
		Bret Watson: In the summer, we had			
		planned to use \$2.35bmillion in B-budget			
		rollover to pay for any budget shortfall. It looks like we will not need to use as the			
		2021/22 budget looks good, but the state			
		predicts deficits after 2022. We need to			
		predicts delicits after 2022. We need to			

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		be cautious and plan smart for the long term. <b>Thuy Nguyen</b> : We'll hold onto the collateral in case we need it later.

		Janie Garcia: Thank you for keeping us			
		well informed on this process.			
		Ram Subramaniam: This is an action			
		item as we need to send a			
		recommendation.			
		Anthony Cervantes: Regarding the			
		Trauma informed Psych Services mental			
		health counselormental health is the			
		number one cause of the petitions I			
		receive. I am surprised it was not ranked			
		higher.			
		Roosevelt Charles: To chime in on the			
		Psych. Services request, we did not do a			
		good job as an institution in educating			
		people about the Trauma Informed			
		Counselor position. It was introduced			

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		after the fact. I don't think we can			
		separate this position from Ethnic			
		Studies. Mental health issues are on the			
		rise. This position supports an emerging			
		need. Do we make a bold statement and			
		fully support the needs of our students?			
		Amy Edwards: I appreciate Roosevelt's			
		comments and agree that there is a			
		need for the Psuch Services position. I			
		missed the Psych Services counselor			
		presentation when I served on this			
		prioritization committee. I was missing			
		data. Do we have numbers on how			
		many people need this service?			
		Roosevelt Charles: We can see if we			
		can get you more information.			
		JP Schumacher: I am echoing the great			
		points from Roosevelt and Amy. Our			
		processes do not align very well when			
		we have emergencies. We can glean			
		information from broader data sets –			
		COVID-19 rates, vaccination rates in			
		Black and brown communities. We are			
		going to see an uptick in mental health			
		services, especially now. This is an			
		opportunity to be proactive on this.			
		April Henderson: Amazing job JP. He			
		explained what I was feeling. EOPS			
		serves a broad spectrum of students,			
		overwhelmingly students of color. Our			
		students don't show up at Town Halls,			
		they are dealing with crises all the time!			
		Our EOPS counselors are constantly			
		dealing with students' crises. Many of our students won't volunteer for surveys			
		and qualitative studies. I just saw this			
		listfrom our experiences, our students			
		are in crisis.			

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ITEM		DISCUSSIONKathryn Maurer: A powerful conversation. So much hurt. Thank you to the prioritization committee. There are always emergent requests. Our process needs to be transparent. As a committee, the fact that we allowed a last-minute request speaks to its importance. This is not a debate about whether or not this is worthy. I am hearing a binary debate. We don't need to go there. Potentially, 11-13 positions can be hired? Can we just hire more positions?Bret Watson: We are still running the numbers on the SRP positions. We don't have the final number, but we feel it is approximately 8-8.4 FTF.Thuy Nguyen: My request was for three positions. We have the potential to hire three positions. This looks like Vet Tech, Counseling, and Computer Science.Janie Garcia: Building on Roosevelt and April's comments, students hold trauma from K-12, before students come to this college. We do have a sincere need now.Shaelyn St. Onge-Cole: One of the things to keep in mind when thinking about data is that in Black and brown communities it is not okay to ask for help. So we won't see the data. We need to listen to our Black and brown students.Abhiraj Muhar: I really believe if we don't prioritize this position, everything we have talked about this year will go down the drain. 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		Ram Subramaniam: I am a little			
		concerned about the direction of this			
		conversation. This is not a vote against			
		the position. The committee has			
		prioritized this position. We just did not			
		have the data that other positions			
		provided. We are not denying that we			
		need a trauma-informed counselor. We			
		followed the process. We have three			
		Psych Services counselors. What is their			
		workload? We want to make sure that a			
		new position has enough work. The			
		position is important.			
		Amy Edwards: Taking deep breathsI			
		appreciate people speaking their truths. I			
		feel in this conversation, I have had			
		more information than we had in the			
		prioritization meeting. In the meeting, all			
		we had was Thuy wants to prioritize this			
		position higher and that is not a good			
		enough reason. Just some data would have been helpful.			
		Janie Garcia: Are we voting to approve			
		the list?			
		Ram Subramaniam: We need to send a			
		recommendation to the president. I			
		believe this council has the ability to			
		adjust the ranking.			
		Anthony Cervantes: Can we look at			
		different funding sources for this list.			
		Thuy Nguyen: Please still prioritize in			
		order of importance. We can then look at			
		funding options. Honestly, we don't have			
		to hire anyone. De Anza is not hiring.			
		We also still do not have the final			
		number from District.			
		Anthony Cervantes: Can we look at the			
		list again? I make a motion to move the

		thing-the reason Thuy prioritized this			
		position was that it comes from students.			
		Please approve if you want to show you			
		are student-centered.			
		Josh Pelletier: Move to extend the			
		meeting ten minutes. <b>Kathryn Maurer</b> : Second			
		Amy Edwards, Abhiraj Muhar, Anthony			
		Cervantes, Arjun Agarwal, April			
		Henderson			
		Anthony Cervantes: I understand			
		Kathryn's concerns, but this is a safe			
		space.			
		Abhiraj Muhar: We all have			
		disagreements and I agree with			
		Anthony.			
		Janie Garcia: Our options are to move			
		up the Psych Services position or			
		approve the rankings as submitted.			
		Thuy Nguyen: I appreciate this			
		conversation. I am committed to hiring			
		full-time faculty.			
		Josh Pelletier: I voted yes on this initial			
		prioritization in the committee, but what I			
		heard today has reframed my thinking.			

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		That is why I voted yes to move the			
		Psych Services position up to #3.			
		Abhiraj Muhar: Maybe the process is			
		flawed? I would love to see a stipulation			
		in the motion that we also look at the			
		process moving forward.			
		Steve Batham: If this process is flawed,			
		a dozen people were assessing the data			
		and all our work is wiped out by this			
		discussions. There are lots of positions			
		on this list tied to equity.			
		Kristy Lisle: This is a more data-driven			
		process than the old process. The way			
		in which proposals are written is			
		important. We are getting better every			
		year. We are looking for better criteria to			
		evaluate non-instructional support			
		positions. We did the ranking. The			
		process is not flawed and is better than			
		the process used for the previous 15			
		years. It is difficult. It is so much better			
		than four years ago.			
		Thuy Nguyen: Thank you Kristy for your			
		comments. Thank you to the			
		prioritization committee. As we look at			
		our structure, we should not be surprised			
		the data has flaws. We need to go beyond our culture. I am hopeful we are			
		getting more sophisticated. E&E has			
		been asking how they can get into the			
		prioritization discussion. As tough as this			
		conversation has been, it is actually a			
		good sign. This is why I love Foothill,			
		that we can have this conversation.			
		Anthony Cervantes: I hope the			
		committee does not feel uncomfortable.			
		A lot of stuff you cannot find data on. We			
		put a vote out there or maybe we say we			

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		<ul> <li>could not. We might not have an answer now. That could be our decision.</li> <li>Ram Subramaniam: My comment was not far from Anthony's. We are late in the hiring process, late to hire, perhaps we can come back. Many of us have another meeting in 12 minutes.</li> <li>Thuy Nguyen: Position was not FT, tenure track initially. As it is now FT, tenure track, it might be successful this time.</li> <li>Katy Ripp: When will the District let us know about the budget?</li> <li>Thuy Nguyen: I am willing to take the risk and hire three positions.
