2021 CONFERENCE THEME: LEADING WITH CLARITY, DETERMINATION, AND PURPOSE

Long-time beacons of hope in our communities, our colleges stand on the threshold between what has been and what is yet to be. This space—known as liminality—is experienced during periods of change, and the last year has been the most transformative that many of us will experience in our lifetimes. A deadly pandemic, unemployment, illness, political violence, massive protests, and heightened awareness of racial injustice have forced us to change quickly. So let us simplify processes and support for our students to help them meet their financial, housing, food, mental health, and other essential needs. Let us streamline pathways for job training, degree completion, and transfer. And let us provide high-touch support to help students succeed. In the words of Amanda Gorman from her poem, The Hill We Climb: We will not march back to what was, but move to what shall be, a country that is bruised but whole, benevolent but bold, fierce and free. We will not be turned around or interrupted by intimidation.
