On-Campus Verified Covid Cases

From Jan. 28 - Feb. 5, we had 8 reports from Covidpositive students.

- In all cases, students were exposed off campus.
- This is 0.28% of our currently enrolled students taking on-campus classes.

General Covid News for Santa Clara County

The Santa Clara County Testing Rate is 7.1%. This is the average percentage of tests done by Santa Clara Public Health that are found to be positive in last 7 days. This is an approximate 40-50% decrease from the first 2 weeks of January.



What does up to date and fully vaccinated mean? According to the CDC:

- Up to date and fully vaccinated means a person has received all recommended COVID-19 vaccines, including any booster dose(s) when eligible.
- You are booster eligible 2 months after the J&J vaccine and 5 months after your last dose of Pfizer or Moderna.

Covid Infectious Period.

- Your infectious period starts 1-2 days before you start having symptoms and lasts 5-10 days if you are vaccinate.
- Testing on day 5 or later with a home antigen test kit will help determine if you are still infectious.
- If you are not vaccinated, your infectious period starts 1-2 days before symptoms and lasts 10-14 days depending on symptoms.
