As you are all aware, the Governor released his May Budget Revise yesterday. The budget projections are concerning, to say the least, but the District has been proactive in preparing possible budget scenarios. Foothill College has already started budget-related discussions in shared governance with the Advisory Council and Revenue and Resources taking on the recommendation over hiring holds.

Please get involved in the budget discussions. You can participate in [governance meetings](#), and also communicate with your CS and AS reps and your supervisor to share ideas and ask questions. We will need to mobilize the collected wisdom and experience of everyone on campus

to deal with the upcoming budget challenges.

Governance Updates

Advisory Council

The Advisory Council met on April 24. The group heard updates from Dr. Laurie Scolari and Dr. Kristy Lisle on Student Services and Instruction; the Advisory Council heard about the impressive work both units have done to adapt to the virtual environment. In addition Bret Watson, Dr. Lisle, and Elias Regalado discussed budgeting for summer and fall and issues surrounding a potential return to campus. The Advisory Council agreed that they should meet again on May 1 to look at future processes for potential budget reduction planning.

On May 1, the Advisory Council looked at preparing for potential future financial uncertainties. Much of the meeting focused on four recently-implemented position holds and the rationale for those holds. The Advisory Council agreed that it would be important for both AC and R&R to work closely together as the upcoming budget discussions would involve both councils.


