Our Students: Race and Ethnicity

- 45 Total Students
 - Race/Ethnicity
 - 32 Latino/Hispanic
 - 3 White
 - 1 White & Indian
 - 2 African American/Black
 - 1 Latino & African American
 - 6 Asian

How We Did

- ENGL 209: 66% Success Rate (16/24)
- ENGL 1S: 85% Success Rate (17/20)
- Art 1: 77% Success Rate (34/44)
 - Note: One student withdrew, which brings
 n=44 instead of 45

Success Rates of FYE Students Compared to Non-FYE Classes

Success Rates of Latino/a and Non-Latino/a FYE and Non FYE Students, Fall 2015

Retention

- 41/45 Students (91%)
 - One student withdrew early
 - One student passed both English and Art but transferred to a college closer to home.
 - One student failed English but passed Art
 - One student failed both English and Art

Some conclusions

- Six students failed both English and Art—need a plan of attack here.
- Success rates in English are at least as good as the rest of the college.
- Success rate in Art is much better than the rest of the college– especially among Latino/a students.
 - Possible explanation: Taking basic skills classes increases success in G.E. (no big surprise).
