I kept playing in my own head how much transportation and housing deeply affect Foothill employees, but did not express it as I did not want to highlight to the students that some employees understandably cannot afford to stick around campus. So for now, many of the student activities on campus are concentrated around noon-time. I wonder if there are other solutions so we can have more robust student activities.
