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Mentoring in the Integrated Plan

- Population
 - First-time new students who place along the basic skills pathway
- Outcomes
 Completion of basic skills pathway
 - Successful completion of courses along pathway
 - Identification/improvement of skills to be a successful student (e.g. study skills, etc.)
 - Identification/increase of non-cognitive measures (e.g. confidence, motivation, etc.)
