

STEP 2: STUDENT COMPLETES DAILY HEALTH SELF-ASSESSMENT


Q1: In the last 10 days, have you been diagnosed with COVID-19?

Q2: In the past 48 hours, have you experienced any of the following COVID-19 symptoms: fever or chills, headache or muscle or body aches, cough; new chest pain, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, recent loss of taste or smell, sore throat, nausea or vomiting or diarrhea?

Q3: Have you had close contact with anyone with a confirmed or suspected case of COVID-19 within the past 14 days? (Close contact being within 6 feet (2 meters) and for more than 15 minutes with someone like a friend/family member/classmates/teachers/coaches, co-workers, etc.)


Q4: Have you traveled outside of California within the last 10 days? Please read carefully: If you are 2 weeks past your FINAL dose of Pfizer or Moderna, OR have had a J&J vaccine, select NO. If you are NOT FULLY VACCINATED and HAVE traveled outside of California within the last 10 days, select YES.

Q5: Have you flown on an international flight within the last 10 days?




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GREEN BADGE




RED BADGE




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STEP 3: STUDENT RECEIVES INSTRUCTIONS BASED ON SELF-ASSESSMENT

CONTACT TRACING



KEY DEFINITIONS

■ FULLY VACCINATED

Person received their LAST dose 2+ weeks ago. Second shot for Pfizer and Moderna, only shot for J&J.

■ COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

Headache; runny nose/congestion; sneezing; sore throat; new loss of taste or smell; fever or chills; cough; shortness of breath or difficulty breathing; fatigue; muscle or body aches; nausea or vomiting; diarrhea.

■ CLOSE CONTACT

A close contact is a person who was with a COVID-positive person for more than 15 minutes (within 6 feet) regardless of wearing a mask, regardless of location (close contacts can include indoor and outdoor locations).

STUDENT COVID-19 PROTOCOLS AND HEALTH & SAFETY GUIDELINES

RESPONSE BASED ON VACCINATION STATUS

1. A STUDENT TESTS POSITIVE FOR COVID-19

Regardless of vaccination status:

- **A.** If a student tests positive for COVID, they need to isolate for 10 days away from campus even if fully vaccinated.
- **B.** A student's isolation date begins the first date they had symptoms. If they don't have symptoms, the isolation date starts on the date they were tested for COVID.
- **C.** It's important to understand that a student is infectious even if they are fully vaccinated. This is why they must stay home and remain off campus during their isolation period.

2. A STUDENT WAS EXPOSED TO A COVID-POSITIVE PERSON (WITHIN SIX FEET FOR MORE THAN 15 MINUTES)

Are they **FULLY** vaccinated?

If Yes:

- **A.** If a student has symptoms, they must quarantine for 10 days. Also, they must get tested 5 days after they were exposed to COVID.
- **B.** If they don't have symptoms, they need to get tested 5 days after they were exposed to COVID. (They don't need to quarantine).
- **C.** If the test results come back positive, see #1.

If not fully vaccinated:

- **A.** Even if a student doesn't have symptoms, they must quarantine for 10 days (even if they have a negative COVID test result).

3. A STUDENT HAS COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

Are they **FULLY** vaccinated?

If Yes:

- **A.** They must isolate for 10 days.
- **B.** During that time, they can get tested for COVID.
- **C.** If their test result is negative, they can end their isolation period and return to campus.

If not fully vaccinated:

- **A.** They must isolate for 10 days regardless of a negative COVID test.
- **B.** Isolation starts from the first they had symptoms.

4. A STUDENT TRAVELED OUTSIDE OF CALIFORNIA

Are they **FULLY** vaccinated?

If Yes:

- **A.** They need to monitor themselves for COVID-19 symptoms for 14 days after returning home.
- **B.** No quarantine needed.

If not fully vaccinated:

- **A.** They must get tested 5 days after returning home.
- **B.** They must quarantine for 10 days after returning home.
- **C.** If they test negative and don't have symptoms, they can return to campus 7 days after returning home.
- **D.** If they test negative yet have symptoms, see #3.

5. A STUDENT TRAVELED ON AN INTERNATIONAL FLIGHT

Are they **FULLY** vaccinated?

If Yes:

- **A.** They must get tested 5 days after returning home.
- **B.** If their test result is positive, see #1.
- **C.** They need to monitor themselves for COVID-19 symptoms for full 14 days after returning home.
- **D.** No quarantine needed.

If not fully vaccinated:

- **A.** They must get tested 5 days after returning home.
- **B.** They must quarantine for 10 days after returning home.
- **C.** If they test negative and don't have symptoms, they can return to campus 7 days after returning home.

IN CASE OF WORSENING COVID SITUATION (MORE CONSERVATIVE)

1. A STUDENT TESTED POSITIVE FOR COVID-19

- **A.** If a student tests positive for COVID, they need to isolate for 10 days away from campus even if fully vaccinated.
- **B.** A student's isolation date begins the first date they had symptoms. IF they don't have symptoms, the isolation date starts on the date they were tested for COVID.
- **C.** It's important to understand that a student is infectious even if they are fully vaccinated. This is why they must stay at home and remain off campus during

2. A STUDENT WAS EXPOSED TO A COVID-POSITIVE PERSON (WITHIN SIX FEET FOR MORE THAN 15 MINUTES)

- **A.** Even if a student doesn't have symptoms, they must quarantine for 10 days (even if they have a negative COVID test result).
- **B.** Keep monitoring for symptoms for a full 14 days after exposure.

3. A STUDENT HAS COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

- **A.** They must isolate for 10 days regardless of a negative COVID test.
- **B.** Isolation starts from the first day they had symptoms.

4. A STUDENT TRAVELED OUTSIDE OF CALIFORNIA


- **A.** They must get tested 5 days after returning home.
- **B.** They must quarantine for 10 days after returning home.
- **C.** If they test negative and don't have symptoms, they can return to campus 7 days after returning home.
- **D.** If they test negative yet have symptoms, see #3.

5. A STUDENT TRAVELED ON AN INTERNATIONAL FLIGHT


- **A.** They must get tested 5 days after returning home.
- **B.** They must quarantine for 10 days after returning home.
- **C.** If they test negative and don't have symptoms, they can return to campus 7 days after returning home.
- **D.** Student should continue monitoring for symptoms for a full 14 days after travel.
