

Why Focus On Race?

I have been contemplating for some time now how to get more faculty and staff to be engaged in the college's "equity" efforts. We have many faculty members, for instance, who teach race relations, social justice, and race discrimination in their own classes. Some of us are even experts, and are called upon by

people outside the college. I wish we could "hire" pro bono our own faculty and staff to serve as consultants to our own equity work. We could learn a lot from many of you. Thus, I am working with our Equity Office to get more engagement of faculty and staff in the work.

One of the ideas for more faculty/staff engagement is the creation of a Foothill-published journal where we would feature scholarship by faculty, classified professionals, administrators, and students in racial equity. This is why the survey was sent, with the last set of questions related to scholarship and research. The journal would be the first in the country by a community college, as far as we know. I've also reached out to the University of California, Irvine's School of Education to provide support for the journal. If the first-year pilot goes well, the goal is to publish annually hard copies for mass distribution at the college (and nationally upon request).

During the Town Hall on Equity Plan 2.0 last week, there was much conversation as to why the focus on race, considering the intersection with other experiences such as poverty, LGBTQ+, veterans, gender, immigration-status, and disabilities. Why focus on race? That is a question the college needs to answer if it is to make progress on its most persistent, college-wide gap.

Indeed, our college continues to provide support for <u>all</u> students. This week is Undocumented Student Action Week with a training on Wednesday.

As you know, the Mellon Scholars Program is a learning community at Foothill to encourage students from diverse backgrounds to explore the humanities.

Last week, the *Revenue & Resources Council* discussed student housing as part of the revision of the Facilities Master Plan and in response to the recommendations from last year's Summit on Student Homelessness. Stay posted for updates and announcements from R & R Council.

Student homelessness is also another area that intersects race and other identifiers. According to the HOPE study, there were larger percentages of students (greater than the college average of 19%) who were undocumented/undeclared immigration status, African Americans, and LGBTQ+ students at Foothill. The study did not focus on veterans status, and a subsequent study is being conducted.

One area of our campus that is showing a lesser racial equity gap is the athletics program. This, in light of the large number of students of color in team sports such as football, is commendable. Of course, this is not to say that the racial gap could close entirely and thus, the division continues to work on efforts such as its Scholar Athletes program and faculty/staff participation in Beyond Diversity training – among others.

Speaking of football, yes, the Owl team won this past weekend

and remains undefeated!




