
You may recall that Foothill College celebrated the 50th Anniversary of Celebrity Forum in 2017-18 with now President-Elect **Joe Biden** as the first speaker and Prof. **Jill Biden** as the last speaker in the yearlong series. Leaders at our college district (present and past) have played an important role in the national education agenda, and I look forward to Foothill College continuing to be at the center of such national policy discussions!

Quite frankly, regardless of the outcome of the presidential election, I am proud to say that Foothill College is focused on our efforts to support all our students in their educational goals and to work to truly achieve a college where a student's success is not predictable by their race. We will continue to do our part to create a more democratic and just society.

One evidence of that is the re-election of our trustees **Laura Casas, Peter Landsberger, and Gilbert Wong** who along with Board Chair **Pearl Cheng** and Trustee **Patrick Ahrens** broke tradition and voted unanimously last Monday on the Board Priorities with the sole focus on racial equity. When one addresses institutional racism, it is inevitable that such work challenges the existing structure of power and privilege and can be unsettling for people with such power and privilege. For the Board of Trustees to address the matter in this manner sends a clear message, and I admire them deeply for their focus and courage. We look forward to our Equity Plan 2.0 aligning with their priority.

Today (Nov. 8) is National First-Gen Day, and we will continue to celebrate First-Gen students at Foothill College. The election of **Kamala Harris** to the vice presidency has generated many “first” records in the country. You can imagine that I am particularly elated by her election as a lawyer from Oakland! Our college will hold an inauguration-watching event, so stay tuned.

In the meantime, join Student Trustee **Priya V.** and Political Science Prof. **Kerri Ryer** who are organizing the post-election town hall for students on Tuesday. Please consider giving credits to students to join. I heard there will be other great faculty speakers reflecting on the election! Faculty/staff are also invited.

One of the concerns raised at the faculty/staff post-election gathering last Wednesday was how divided the country is. Keep in mind that **Biden/Harris** is slated to win both the popular vote and electoral votes with record votes.

It is still noticeable how divided the country is, including Congress. Yet, I think about how Foothill faculty often navigate such space and teach in classrooms with diverse views – challenging students to think critically, to decipher fact from fiction, and to find their own agency in their education. One of the main reasons why I launched *Service Leadership* the following quarter after the 2016 presidential election is my own concern about the state of our country. The goal was to prepare students for leadership that is grounded in service – and along with that, ethics, diplomacy, critical thinking, cultural awareness, race-consciousness, global citizenship, compassion, and effective communication -- to name a few. Many of you were already engaging in such work, and to have a college-wide theme/philosophy enabled more support of such activities. *Service Leadership* is also grounded in racial equity -- as the research shows this is a proven equity strategy. Thank you to all the faculty, classified professionals, and administrators who continue to invest in our students and their leadership!

Last Monday's Briefing, we talked about what we could do to lower our stress level in light of the pandemic. Hope you are feeling less stressed and more hopeful for 2021. Based on those who have reached out to me this weekend, it seems to be so!
