

Reviewer Worksheet: Lab Report Reference Section

You should keep a list of materials (books, journals, websites etc.) you referenced when researching your topic. This list will grow as you actually sit down to write the different sections of a formal paper. You need to be able to find your source material so make sure you follow a format that includes pertinent data (e.g. title, author, volume, page, publisher, year, edition, update date etc.). The exact format that needs to be followed depends on where a work is published.

Please review the student's reference section for the following features:

- ☐ Are there enough references for the project (experiment)?
 - Typically there needs to be at least three (3) references
 - The majority of the references need to be *primary*.
- ☐ Are there obvious references missing?
- ☐ Are the references appropriate?
- ☐ Are the references able to be found from the given information?
- ☐ Has the writer checked the spelling, grammar and punctuation?
