

Foothill will then debut its new 26-unit Video Gaming Skills Certificate Program this fall when classes get underway **Sept. 25.** California residents pay \$17 per unit for Foothill classes.

Designed to prepare you for entry into a rigorous gaming development program at a four-year university, the required courses for the Foothill program include CIS 55A: Introduction to Games; CIS 15A: Computer Science I: C++; CIS 15B: Computer Science II: C++; CIS 55B: Introduction to Game Design; CAST 70D: Three-Dimensional Modeling & Animation; and CAST 92A: Introduction to Adobe Photoshop.

Upon completion of the program, you'll have a comprehensive background of the gaming industry as well as a solid foundation in C++ programming.

Foothill President, President Bush & Governor Schwarzenegger Discuss American Competitiveness Initiative

Foothill College President Bernadine Chuck Fong, Ph.D., participated in the American Competitiveness Initiative panel discussion along with President George W. Bush, California Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger and Cisco Systems CEO John Chambers April 20. The group discussed the vital role U.S. community colleges fill in training more students for highwage, high-demand careers in science and technology.

Dr. Fong was invited to the panel because Foothill College is a powerhouse among community colleges in preparing students for science and technology careers. Under the leadership of Computer Networking Instructor **Mike Murphy,**Foothill also has the largest Cisco Network Technology Academy in the Bay Area—more than 520 students have enrolled in the innovative program. Foothill faculty and college leaders see improving students' science and math success rates as a top priority for Silicon Valley.

"The community college system is one of America's greatest treasures, and I appreciate you, Dr. Fong, for being here," President Bush said. "Added value in education can come in all different ways. And one such place is in our community college system. You've got a great community college system here in California."

During the discussion, President Bush asked Dr. Fong to explain how the Cisco Academy works at Foothill College. "The Cisco Academy is basically a degree program. Students earn Foothill's associate degree in network enterprise, and they earn a Cisco certificate," Dr. Fong said.

"What's interesting about the community colleges is that they're about as market oriented as you can get," President Bush said. "Community colleges are available, they're flexible. The curricula can adjust depending upon local needs. They're innovative. They're willing to take a Cisco program, implement it in the community college. They're practical and they train people for jobs which actually exist."

Gov. Schwarzenegger, himself a product of the California community colleges who attended courses at Santa Monica College, said "California's community colleges are doing an extraordinary job with career and vocational education. We want to stress four-year college, and yes, we want to inspire students of all ages to pursue higher education."







Krause Center for Innovation Kicks Off \$7.5 Million Endowment Campaign

With the recent gift of \$500,000 from Bill and Gay Krause,

Foothill College launched a \$7.5 million endowment campaign for its Krause Center for Innovation, to solidify Foothill's future as a regional center for training educators and students in the latest technology.

With the goal of keeping Silicon Valley teachers and students technologically competitive in the global marketplace, the KCI trains educators and community members through programs such as FastTech, Learning in New Media Classrooms (LINC) and Earn While You Learn, a summer technology institute for Bay Area K-12 teachers.

"By building a \$7.5 million endowment, we will secure the future of the KCI for generations as a critical resource for technology instruction and integrating technology into the K-12 curriculum," says Gay Krause, KCI executive director. The endowed funds will be used for training grants for teachers, ensuring the KCI has the latest hardware and software and supporting an endowed instructor with leadership in technology training.

Recently, Silicon Valley leaders such as Morgan Family Foundation President Becky Morgan and Ned and Jimi **Barnholt,** met at the KCI to learn more about its innovative programs such as the California Multimedia Festival and the Rambus/KCI Technology Innovation Award. During the meeting, Gay and Bill Krause announced their pledge of \$500,000, which brings the total in hand to \$1.5 million. They encouraged area philanthropists to join them in transforming classroom teaching to better prepare students for careers in technology and the sciences. Foothill Students & Community Members Dive into Aegean Sea to Explore Ancient Volcano with Famed Oceanographer Robert Ballard

Foothill College recently hosted live broadcasts from the Aegean Sea floor and Thera volcano as one of the sites selected to present Robert Ballard's Ancient Eruptions project, which is organized by Immersion Presents. For five days, Foothill students and community members had front row seats as Ballard and other scientists explored the volcano's origins on the Greek island of Thera (Santorini) using an underwater robot equipped with highdefinition cameras and "arms" delicate enough to pick up geologic samples.

Using ground-breaking robotic and communication technologies, Foothill audiences participated in the expedition virtually—seeing everything the expedition scientists saw in real time, broadcast from unmanned submarines. Students enrolled in Foothill's geology and

oceanography classes viewed the expedition and had voice contact to ask questions of the researchers. This innovative method of instruction will be

an ongoing addition to Foothill's GEO 10: Introductory Geoscience and OCEN 10: General Oceanography classes.
