Hands-On History

Work Shoulder to Shoulder with Scientists at an Archeology Dig

Spend summer working shoulder to shoulder with scientists **Andrew Kindon** and **Roger Kelly** as part of the team investigating the Samuel Adams Lime Kilns at Wilder Ranch State Park in Santa Cruz. The investigation is part of the Foothill-West Valley Archaeological Survey and is offered as the four-unit *ANTH 11: Archaeological Field Methods* course, which meets

Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays, July 9 through Aug. 8.

When the survey project began in 2007, its purpose was to investigate the lime kilns and associated structures of the Adams Creek Lime Kilns site, which were at one time part of Henry Cowell's lime kiln operations, and develop a better understanding of the people who worked at the kilns and the nature of their daily life. Through a variety of class projects, including ongoing excavations, remote sensing and laboratory analysis, students who participate in the survey project continue to paint a more complete and inclusive picture of the early development of Santa Cruz and the role which a variety of people played in both the lime industry and the history of the area.

The course is transferable to CSU campuses as well as some UC campuses.
