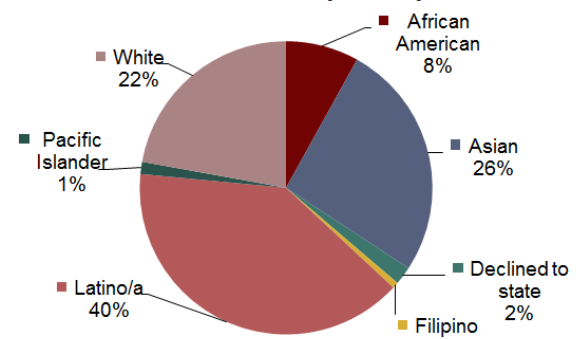

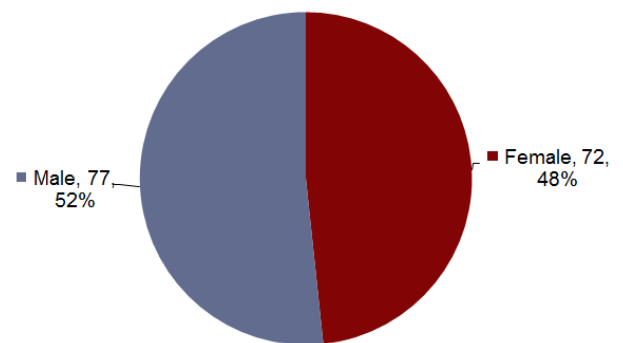
## Student Characteristics
