1. Call to Order:

a. Yonok College, Lampang Thailand

Warren Hurd announced that there is a possibility for partnership with Yonok College in Lampang, Thailand. This is a liberal arts college with 13,000 students. There is a possibility that Thailand students may come to study here at Foothill College. There may be teaching opportunities for Foothill Instructors to teach in Thailand. There will be an Honorarium for housing and transportation for faculty members interested in teaching in Thailand.

This Ad Hoc committee is looking at teaching/learning opportunities at Maui College and at Yonok College in Lampang, Thailand. Yonok College in Lampang, Thailand will be focusing on the International/undergraduate degrees which are open to all disciplines.
