a. State of the College –Budget & Planning Update - Fong

We are now working on budget update twelve. The college is now using a worse case scenario of 20 million dollars in necessary reductions, based on Governor Davis holding form on proposed general fund cuts. We are reducing 1320 (P/T employee) and categorical spending. Faculty members affected by cuts have been very supportive of reassignment. The need for current and accurate FSAs, and the Senates' responsibility in aggregating those data, will help this process. We are not asking for one-month voluntary leave from 11 and 12month employees, nor are we discussing salary freezes or cuts. The college is in good shape because the Board of Governors has decided to act prudently and cut expenses sooner. We will examine productivity more in the future, and it was noted that 65% of WSCH was above 530 and 35% below 530. An additional mode of savings could be to lower growth targets. It was noted that community colleges have not been a strong voice in communicating to the California Legislature the drastic effects and impact these cuts will have on education at the community level.
