Health services will face a significant reduction in funding, perhaps as much as \$270K, which could impact health services.
- f. FSA and Disciplines Presentation (Barker) follow-up. Shirley continued her discussion of FSAs and disciplines. FSAs currently with divisions should be reviewed carefully, with changes and recommendations forwarded to FA. As a group we reviewed the application of FSAs to example classes, and created a list of ten questions that should be pursued to further the understanding and applications of FSA to courses and disciplines.
