RE: Fall 2016 Embedded Tutoring Survey Results

Overview

Students who participated in the Fall 2016 Embedded Tutoring Program, as hosted by the Teaching and Learning Center, were surveyed at the beginning of the Winter Quarter to determine their satisfaction with the program. The survey was open for one week, with a 10% response rate of a total of 70 students completing the survey. Out of the 70 students who received the email survey invite, 54 are still enrolled in the winter term.

Highlights

- All respondents stated that their primary motivation to attend embedded tutoring sessions was to increase their understanding of course material (71%) or to improve their study skills (29%).
- Half of the students attended embedded tutoring sessions at least once a week, with 25% attending a session twice per week.
- A majority of respondents (83%) received other forms of tutoring on top of embedded tutoring. Students indicated their other forms of tutoring came from classmates and/or friends (50%), the Teaching and Learning Center (17%), private tutoring sessions (8%), and the STEM Center (8%).
- A slight majority of students preferred small group tutoring (57%) above individual tutoring (43%).
- A majority of the respondents (86%) found the material covered in embedded tutoring sessions to be different enough from the lectures to keep the sessions interesting.
- All students either strongly agreed or agreed that embedded tutoring was offered at a time that fit their schedule, and that sessions helped them recognize the course content they needed to study for.
- A majority of students (86%) felt comfortable speaking and participating in the embedded tutoring sessions.
- All respondents would recommend embedded tutoring to a friend.

Methodology

The survey was created by FHDA IR&P using Remark survey software and the Teaching and Learning Center provided the list of participating students who received embedded tutoring. The survey was distributed on January 17, 2017 to January 24, 2017 and students received an email invite with the survey link embedded.

The low response rate is mainly attributed to the survey administration period; hence future efforts will schedule the email survey invite to be sent during week 10 of the quarter. Other reasons could include lack of incentive and no announcement made to students about receiving a survey.















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





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
9b. Embedded Tutoring changed the way I study for this course.





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


9f. Attending sessions helped me become more aware of my academic strengths and weaknesses.



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





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
10. Did you feel comfortable speaking and participating in the Embedded Tutoring sessions?


11. Do you think that attending Embedded Tutoring sessions means you don't have to spend as much time studying on your own?


