RE: Non-Credit Parenting (NCP) Enrollment, 2014-15 (United Way)

Overview

Students who registered for Non-Credit Parenting (NCP) courses in 2014-15 academic year were identified to determine their course enrollment patterns (refer to the Methodology section for sections included). There were 186 students enrolled in at least one NCP course in 2014-15, making up for an enrollment of 203. Table 1 shows that fewer than 10% of NCP students enrolled in at least two NCP courses in 2014 (9%). There were no NCP students enrolled in a credit course during the same time period.

Not all NCP courses were offered every term (Table 2). Note that NCP 401 was not offered in 2014-15. Enrollment in NCP 403 during Summer 2014 accounted for half of the NCP enrollment (51%) while NCP 400 only accounted for 19%. Appendix 1 shows the enrollment data at the course and section levels.

As noted earlier, almost all the student enrolled in only one NCP section during 2014-15 (91%) while the remaining students enrolled in two NCP sections (9%) (Table 3).

Table 4 shows the combination of NCP courses in which students enrolled. Almost all the students enrolled in only one NCP course (98%). There were four students who were enrolled in either NCP 400/403 or NCP 402/403 (2%). Note that the table does not show the number of NCP sections in which students enrolled, as a student could be enrolled in multiple sections of one NCP course. In this case, 10 students were enrolled in two sections of NCP 402 while one student enrolled in two sections of NCP 400 and 2 students in two sections of NCP 403.

The majority of NCP students are female (69%) while a little over one-fourth are male (29%) (Table 5).

Almost two-thirds of NCP students are Latino/a (65%), while Asians/Filipino/Pacific Islanders compose the second highest represented student group (23%) just ahead of those who declined to state their ethnicity (6%) (Table 6).

Table 7 shows that the educational level among at least half of NCP students is unknown (53%). Approximately one-fourth of NCP students either earned a HS diploma or equivalent (23%) and another one-fifth attained at least a bachelor's degree (19%).

### Methodology

NCP courses are non-credit and no final grade is awarded. Students were identified based on registration codes indicating registration (RA, RE, RW). Eleven students had multiple educational levels reported; the highest level was counted in this analysis. The following sections were included this analysis:

*Summer 2014:* NCP 403 CRN 10848, 10849

*Fall 2014:* NCP 400 CRN 21637, 21639

*Winter 2015:* NCP 402 CRN 31747, 31749

*Spring 2015:* NCP 402 CRN 42429
