
Student Trends

- About one quarter of the student population comes from Foothill's service area (24.8%).
- Over one quarter of students are full-time (28.2%).
- Almost half of students are 24 years old or younger (46.2%).
- Over half of students have goal of earning a degree, certificate, or transferring (51.7%).



Santa Clara County Adult Population






- Foothill student population reflective of Santa Clara County's diversity.

Santa Clara County Public HS Graduates





Foothill FTES






- Asian/Filipino/PI and White students make up 63% of Foothill population.


- Decline in number of certificates and degrees awarded.


- Transfer rate to ISP, OoS, and UCs remain relatively constant.


- Course success and retention rates remain higher than state average.

FH Course Success Rates by Ethnicity





FH Vocational Education Course Success





FH Basic Skills Course Success





FH Student Progress & Achievement Rate



Foothill Fall to Fall Persistence Rate






- Persistence rate for all students are above 60% over past five years.

Foothill Fall to Winter Persistence





FH Fall to Winter Persistence by Ethnicity





Foothill Employee Headcount






- Majority of faculty identify themselves as White (62%).

San Mateo County Adult Population





Appendix 3: F-1 Visa Status


