### Foothill Apprenticeship Programs Recognized as "Strongworkforce Star"

State Sen. Jerry Hill presented Foothill College with a Joint Legislative Resolution on Dec. 14th that recognized the college's recent honor as a California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office "Strong Workforce Star." The state Chancellor's Office selected Foothill as a "Strong Workforce Star" for its Construction Crafts Apprenticeship Program. The award acknowledges that 78% of students who participate in the Construction Crafts Apprenticeship Program achieved earnings equal to or better than the regional living-wage benchmark. The high number places Foothill College in the top 5 out of 114 community colleges in the state. The Construction Crafts program spans multiple apprenticeship pathways, including General and Residential Electrician; Field Ironworker; Plumbing, Pipefitting and Steamfitting; Refrigeration, Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning; and Sheet Metal.

#### Kinesiology and Fine Arts Faculty Service to Toys for Tots in December



### KCI Keeps Students And Teachers Tech-Savvy



The Krause Center for Innovation at Foothill College held a ribbon-cutting and grand-opening ceremony on Dec. 2nd for the new Underground Makerspace, which will serve the FH college community, K-14 teachers and students by providing hands-on learning programs using the latest technology. "We had over 100 people visit the KCI Underground," said KCI Executive Director Gay Krause of opening day. "Visitors created LED flashlights, paper circuit holiday cards and gift boxes using materials cut with our Circuit Maker.

Additionally, we had three Dremel 3-D printers running, along with the new laser cutter, which created acrylic cut and etched keychains commemorating the event." KCI and Foothill secured nearly \$40,000 in grant funding from the California Community Colleges Maker initiative to create the Underground Makerspace, located on the bottom floor of the KCI building on campus.
